Oct. 2020 Leader Member Minutes

The AMA has joined with AOPA (Aircraft Owners Pilot Assocation), EAA (Experimental Aircraft Association) and Wings, (a Google sister group) to send an letter urging the FAA to make essential changes to the proposed rule for Remote ID of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS). These stakeholders represent a cross section of the model aviation, general aviation, and commercial UAS sectors and share a concern that the current rule is too difficult for everyday hobbyists to comply with and that alternatives are needed.

Be aware that you may be subject to significant penalties of \$20,000 or more if you operate a drone and interfere with emergency response operations. Flying a drone without authorization in or near the disaster area may violate federal, state, or local laws and ordinances, even if a TFR (Temporary Flight Restriction) is not in place. Allow first responders to save lives and property without interference.

AMA Safety/Technical director, Tony Stillman, will be providing updates on the FAA's forthcoming testing requirement. Check AMA Emails and Model Aviation.

The record for highest altitude remote-controlled (RC) model aircraft flight of 34,800 ft. was ratified in August 2020 by The Guinness World Records. This flight took place in New Mexico.



No Meeting in October 2020 at Area 52 Field. Check out our web site: HTTP://WWW.BAYCITYFLYERS.ORG

Review the Bulletin Board and our Website to keep informed of what is happening at the flying fields.

The main gate at the flying field 52 must be kept locked when entering or leaving the field. The four tumblers must be turned each time the lock is closed. When entering the field if you find only one tumbler has been turned, try to find the last member who entered the field and closed the lock incorrectly. Explain to the individual that all four tumblers must be turned.
